Question: The SCN was asked by the Thames Valley CCG Accountable Officer/ Clinical Chair Forum to provide guidance that the CCGs could consider in their planning round.

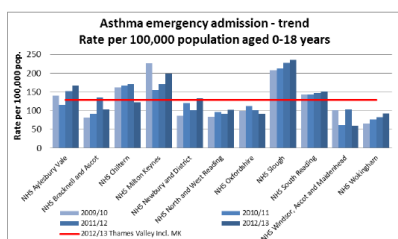
Solution: As a Network we produced a 35 slide deck explaining the benefit for the patient population on focussing on specific areas using data and clinical evidence backed up by local knowledge. The pack contained information on the background of the topic, the evidence base and SCN work in the area along a comparative quality map focussing on the quality variation across the Thames Valley and actions recommended by the SCN. This guidance was presented, was very well received and has provided impetus to planning and changes to commissioning.

Outcome: New areas have been identified where major elements of variation exists (such as the commissioning of paediatric palliative care vs adult palliative care), where further commitment and focus was required (Stroke services across Oxfordshire, MK & Berkshire East) and a shared understanding of where improvements can be made (using the peer examples of Diabetes—Berks West/MK).

Childhood Asthma



Background

UK has one of the highest prevalence rates of asthma symptoms in children worldwide with 1.1 million children in the UK currently receiving treatment for asthma. It has been estimated that as many as 90% of deaths from asthma are preventable. Asthma UK conducted a "Compare your care" survey in 2013 which revealed that only 1 in 4 people with asthma had been given an asthma action plan yet data shows that patients who use an asthma action plan are 4 times less likely to have an attack that requires emergency hospital treatment.

SCN work

TVSCN are working with GP Facilitators across Buckinghamshire/Oxon, Berkshire and Milton Keynes to:

- aid the full implementation of NICE QS25 Quality standards for asthma (Issued Feb 2013)
- aid the implementation of British Guidelines on the management of asthma (BTS/SIGN)
- provide specific emphasis on self-management education and personalised action plans in CYP
- encourage use of management strategies for recurrent viral wheeze in young children

Commissioning Intentions

- In line with patient centred care and self-management, all children and young people with an asthma or viral wheeze diagnosis should have a written personalised asthma action plan.
- As a development from the TV Children & Maternity SCN, Clinical Director, Anne Thomson who sits on the NHS England's Clinical Reference Group on Paediatric Medicine, NHS England are developing a Best Practice Tariff for Paediatric Asthma for implementation in 2016/17. This will follow a similar vein to how the paediatric diabetes best practice tariff is defined and implemented.

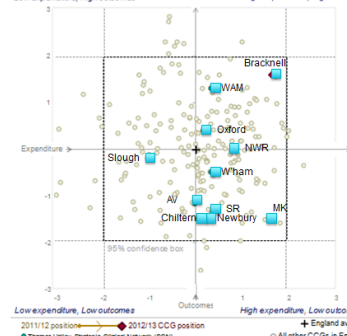
