
The Royal College of GPs and Marie Curie, in partnership, launch the Daffodil Standards: GP surgeries will now be able to display a 'daffodil mark' as a sign of commitment to improving end of life care. Surgeries work to a criteria called the Daffodil Standards, a set of **eight quality improvement** statements designed to support primary care teams in delivering care to patients:

1. Professional and competent staff.
2. Early identification of patients and carers.
3. Carer support before and after death.
4. Seamless, planned, coordinated care.
5. Assessment of unique needs of the patient.
6. Quality care during the last days of life.
7. Care after death.
8. General practices being hubs within compassionate communities.



Together in Dementia Everyday (tide) and (Dementia Engagement and Empowerment Project (DEEP) produce a new report on end of life conversations in dementia care: This report sets out how people with dementia and their carers need more support to have conversations around death and dying in order to make end of life care plans, and implement post-bereavement support. It also outlines that professionals need additional training and education to facilitate and empower people to have conversations. The report concludes with a set of recommendations.
